Strategic Priority Commitments:

Economic & Community Development Empower Economic Development, and Brownfield Development within the Southern Wayne County region	Support and drive legislation that empowers local authorities like the Downriver Community Conference, and municipal government to engage in economic development programs and activities that attract developers and employers to our community.
	Oppose legislation that takes resources and control unnecessarily away from local authorities.
	Support programs and legislation that provides economic development programs and resources such as infrastructure development and economic tools to provide opportunities for development in our region.
	Support efforts that empower our communities with updated critical infrastructure, including roads/bridges, pipelines/utilities, and broadband.
Education and Talent Attraction Attract talent and empower our workforce with education and training to effectively serve our region.	Support programs and legislation that provides funding for talent attraction activities, including but not limited to Destination Downriver and Pure Michigan.
